

Today, March 28, Begins Holy Week. We will not have our usual Wednesday Night Family Gathering. We will be observing Maundy Thursday on April 1 in King Hall at 7:00 pm.

For this Maundy Thursday service we remember the Last Supper, Jesus praying in the Garden of Gethsemane, and His death on the cross. The name, Maundy Thursday, comes from the new mandate or commandment Jesus gave during the Last Supper when He said, "A new commandment I give you, that you love one another: just as I loved you, you also are to love one another." (John 13:34)

DELIGHTING IN THE TRINITY - Question 5 of the Westminster Shorter Catechism asks the question, "Are there more Gods than one?" The answer to the question is, "There is but one only, the living and true God." The next question in the catechism is, "How many persons are there in the Godhead?" The answer is, "There are three persons in the Godhead; the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost; and these three are one God, the same in substance, equal in power and glory." How can God be three persons, yet one God? The doctrine of the Trinity is foundational to the Christian faith and yet the word "Trinity" is not mentioned in the Bible. We endeavor together as Christians not just assent to the doctrine but to actually be moved by a glorious and rich understanding of our trinitarian God. On Sunday, March 7, from 10:10 to 10:45 through Sunday, May 28, come to King Hall for this great Adult Sunday School opportunity to grow in what it means to Delight in the Trinity.
