

Why Mentoring?

At the age of 12, the Lord started something in my life.

I had just met Jesus, was entering middle school (on the edge of puberty) and needed someone to walk with me into unchartered territory. Someone to come alongside. Someone to listen. Someone who had been there. Someone with wisdom, Someone who loved Jesus and had been walking with Him awhile. A woman. Kibbie.

The Lord has been faithful in my life to provide a long list of women, all along the way, who have walked with me. Discipled me. Loved me. Modeled for me what being a godly woman, wife, mother, and friend looked like in real life. The good, the bad and the glorious!

These women understood and were obedient to the biblical mandate (Titus 2:3-5) to mentor. If you were to ask them:

- » Did they feel worthy?
- » Did they feel they had anything to offer?
- » Did they have all the answers?

They would have definitely said, "NO!" But they did love younger women and have a desire to be available, to be life-giving, and to make disciples.

This idea of mentoring isn't man-made or just another good idea for Christians. It's something we see in many of the one-on-one relationships sprinkled throughout scripture.*











Mary and Elizabeth, as portrayed in the first chapter of Luke. These two women made themselves available to one another for relationship during a very exciting and challenging time in their lives. This close relationship between these two biblical women, one young and one a bit older, prompts us to consider a few characteristics to look for when considering a mentor/mentee relationship with another woman:

For example, take a look at the relationship between

Elizabeth was a step ahead of Mary in her own journey. She shared common experiences with Mary and understood Mary. Elizabeth encouraged Mary to walk in obedience and she modeled Spirit-filled living in the face of unfamiliar territory.

Mary was a good mentee in her relationship with Elizabeth because she took initiative and pursued Elizabeth. She was humble and teachable and wanted God's will for her life more than anything. Mary also gave Elizabeth the commitment of time together.

How marvelous for both Mary and Elizabeth to walk alongside one another during such a miraculous, yet terrifying season of life. Don't we all need relationships like this in our lives?

If you haven't figured it out yet, I am kind of passionate about this. I see the immense value that having relationship with those who have gone before me has added to my own life. I have also had the honor of walking with multiple women who are blazing their own trail after me. I can't help but get excited!

You may be thinking, "I would really like to have a relationship like that with another woman, But where do I start?"

On Wednesday nights starting on February 16, you are invited to come together with other women at FPC Rome and learn more about mentoring.
